## Interpreting the FOCCUS® Couple Report

- The FOCCUS© Couple Report is to be shared with a couple only by a trained FOCCUS Facilitator with the aid of a FOCCUS© FACILITATOR MANUAL. The report is not to be copied or given to the couple to keep. FOCCUS© Pre-Marriage Inventory is not a test. Couples cannot fail it. This report and the facilitation process are intended to help couples affirm their strengths and discuss issues that could be problems for them or that need more communication between them.
- Page 2 (the current page) presents the couple's demographic data. Please be mindful of the need to keep this information, as well as the responses
  contained in the report, confidential and private.
- Page 3 of this FOCCUS© Couple Report presents the couple's responses according to the categories outlined in the FOCCUS© Facilitator Manual (Life style
  Expectations, Friends and Interests, etc.). These categories are clustered under the areas in which they fall (Match, Skills, Bonders, etc.). Areas and
  categories are explained in detail in the Facilitator Manual.
  - 1. Couple Agreement by Area is presented in bar graphs that show the percentage of items in each category on which the couple agreed with each other AND the preferred inventory response (thus, no item marked "uncertain").
  - 2. The Special Sections portion of the report presents the percent agreement of couples with each other and the inventory's preferred responses regarding areas of higher risk: Interfaith Marriage, Remarriage, Cohabiting Couples, and Couples with Children. The designation "N/A" in any of these sections indicates the section did not apply for that couple.
  - 3. The Overview of Individuals' Response Patterns section shows 1) the percentage of time the couple's responses agreed with each other (excluding whether the response agreed with the inventory's preferred response), 2) the percentage of responses that agreed with the inventory's preferred response, and 3) the percentage of items the individual marked Unsure.
- Pages 4-12 constitute the Answer Detail by Area portion of the report. In this section, each area is displayed separately, grouping the FOCCUS items within a pattern. The following information is displayed in columns from left to right: 1) the item number, 2) the response of the first respondent, 3) the response of the second respondent, 4) the item's preferred response, 5) Areas for Discussion (items are printed in this column if either individual's response differed from the inventory's preferred response), and 6) Areas of Agreement (items on which the couple agreed with each other and the inventory's preferred response). The placement of items into one of the two latter two columns gives the facilitator a visual display of the couple's responses and their likely challenges and strengths. Critical items (as explained in the Facilitator Manual) are marked with an asterisk (\*).
- Pages 13 + presents couple's responses in the areas of Interfaith Marriage, Remarriage, Cohabiting Couples, and Couples with Children if these sections
  were answered by the couple. The section presents items that are unique to each category as well as relevant items PRINTED IN CAPS that are new and NOT
  duplicated from the main portion of the FOCCUS© Pre Marriage Inventory.


## FOCCUS© FACILITATORS, Please remember:

It is important, however, not to limit FOCCUS discussion to patterns or to turn patterns into labels. No pattern is intended to define a couple.
